Boys Coach

The name "McDonald" is synonymous with Minnesota basketball. Paul played four seasons for his father, the legendary Bob McDonald, at Chisholm High School, winning two state championships

while helping the Bluestreaks to a four-year record of 98-8. Paul left Chisholm for the college game (Nebraska and South Dakota State) before jumpstarting his coaching career at the high school level in Cotton and Tower-Soudan. He recently completed his 21st season as head coach at Vermillion Community College, where he's captured state, region and district Coach of the Year honors. Paul, known for implementing an up-tempo, exciting brand of basketball, also is a two-time finalist for the NJCAA National Coach of the Year award.



Dan Zbosnik
Girls Coach

Another ultra-successful coach from Mesabi Range College, Dan has led the Lady Norse to the postseason nine of the past 10 seasons. His team is coming off a 16-11 mark that included another

championship in the MCAC's Northern Division. An Eveleth native, Dan has coached the Lady Norse to three division championships, an MCAC state consolation crown and a trip to the NJCAA Region XIII title tilt during his 13-year tenure. His teams are renowned for their defensive tenacity and run-and-gun style. Dan has coached 30 All-Division players, 12 All-MCAC players, nine NJCAA All-Region players and two All-Americans. Additionally, his program has captured a bevy of academic awards, including 21 All-MCAC Academic players.

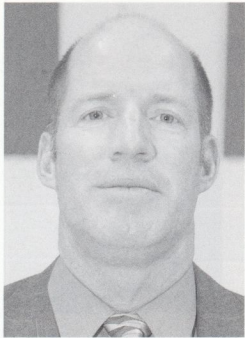

Boys Coach

A native of Glenwood, Minn., Tom played college basketball at Minnesota-Morris. He went on to coach four seasons at Perham High School before leaving to become an assistant at the University of North

Dakota. Today, Tom is a fixture at Mesabi Range College, where he's turned the Norse into an NJCAA state power during his 19-year run on the bench. His program has qualified for the Minnesota Community College State Tournament 14 times, won two division championships and advanced to the Region 13 National Tournament twice (2002 and '04) – he's the only coach in Norse history to guide two squads to the Region 13 event. Aside from Tom's team success, he's coached 13 MCAC All-State performers and two NJCAA All-Americans.



John Bauer
Girls Coach

John breathed new life into the women's program when he arrived at Itasca Community College in 2001. The Lady Vikings have produced five consecutive 20-win seasons, dominating

the Minnesota College Athletic Conference's Northern Division during that stretch. It's no surprise, then, that John has captured division Coach of the Year honors four times. Itasca finished third at the MCAC State Tournament in 2004-05, first in 2005-06 and was the consolation champion a year later. Each of those three seasons, the Lady Vikings were NJCAA Regional runner-ups. John, who went to Grand Rapids High School before attending Itasca and Bemidji State, has seen three of his athletes garner All-American accolades.
